

# Chain of Responsibility (Level 2 – For Supervisors)



## AIM

The aim of the chain of responsibility is to ensure that all who bear responsibility for conduct which affects compliance should be made accountable for failure to discharge that responsibility.

Legislation is now in place to extend the chain of responsibility principle to mass, dimension and load restraint offences. All parties in the transport chain, not just the driver and operator, can be made accountable for these offences. Features of the legislation are the categorisation of offences into minor, substantial and severe breaches, increases in the level of fines, a wider range of administrative sanctions and court orders, and new powers to direct vehicles.

## OUTLINE

- Explaining the chain of responsibility features,
- Applying chain of responsibility requirements, and
- Identifying and reporting chain of responsibility breaches.

## CONTENT

- Action required when possible breaches of the chain of responsibility are identified.
- Consequences of non-compliance with the chain of responsibility.
- Roles including own role, duties performed by others under the individual's supervision and duties that influence or direct other parties in the chain of responsibility.
- Methods and requirements to ensure management of fatigue, speed, load restraint, mass and dimension.
- Identification of all parties in the chain of responsibility.
- Principal obligations relating to chain of responsibility in the HVNL and regulations or applicable state/territory law and regulations
- What constitutes a duty, a reasonable step, a breach and a penalty to chain of responsibility regulations as they apply to a range of job roles
- Where to locate current chain of responsibility information
- Workplace policies and procedures around chain of responsibility for own job role and the range of job roles for which own job role is responsible.
